ARCBridge FIREsolv Plan™ is a stand-alone program that requires no other GIS software. It works with incident data in standalone MS Access or client/server MS SQL Server formats and ESRI shapefiles, including outputs from ARCBridge FIREsolv Net™, to easily analyze and create new information for fire department planning staff. It utilizes a tab-oriented, dialog-driven menu interface structure for input and output of files, maps, reports, and graphs with many query and display features. The end-user can perform historic incident trend analysis against existing and proposed service areas, map comparisons of data over time, create thematic maps and hotspots, display fire infrastructure, equipment locations, create fire map book files, show hazmat locations and building floorplans, and much more.
